deeply grateful to the mighty superheroes of our armed forces," Modi said.

On July 26, 1999, the Indian Army announced the successful culmination of Operation Vijay, declaring victory after a nearly three-month battle on the icy heights of Kargil in Ladakh. The day is observed as Kargil Vijay Diwas to commemorate India's victory over Pakistan.

In his remarks at the Shraddhanjali Samaroh, Modi said the victory in Kargil war was not of any government or any party.

"This victory belongs to the country.

Recalling the days of the Kargil war, Modi said he was fortunate to be amidst soldiers back then and added that he still remembers how the soldiers carried out a difficult operation at such a height.

"I salute the brave sons of the country who made the supreme sacrifice to protect the motherland," he said.

"India will overcome all challenges that come in the way of development, be it Ladakh or Jammu and Kashmir," he said.

# India replaces China as Chair of Asian **Disaster Preparedness Centre**

**NEW DELHI. JULY** 26: India on Friday aspromise that the country will play a global and regional leadership role in the field of Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR), officials in the Union Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) said.

The officials said that India has taken over as the ADPC Chair as China's tenure comes to an end.

"Under Prime Minister Narendra Modi, India is

playing a global and regional leadership role in the field of Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) and the country has taken a number of global initiatives in this direction, especially in establishing an international Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure (CDRI)," a senior MHA offi-

cial said. As a representative of the central government, Rajendra Singh, Member & HoD, National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), has taken over the Chair of

Asian Disaster Preparedness Centre (ADPC) from China for the year 2024-25 in Bangkok on Thursday, the official further said.

ADPC is an autonomous international organisation for cooperation in and implementation of disaster risk reduction and building climate resilience in Asia and the Pacific region.
