An awareness programme was organized by the Sankalp Hub for Empowerment of Women Mission Shakti under the Social Welfare Department Udhampur, in collaboration with the Poshan Project Udhampur, at AWC Kalta Panchayat Padanoo, Udhampur. The event was part of the 100-day special awareness and enrollment drive conducted by Mission Shakti Udham-

The programme was held under the able guidance of Deputy Commissioner Udhampur, Saloni Rai, and supervised by District Social Welfare Of-

ficer, Kanika Gupta. Its primary aim was to educate the

audience about various women-centric schemes and to inform them about significant women-centric legislations such as the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005; the Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961; the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal Act, 2013; and the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006.

The main objective of these schemes and legislations is to uplift and empower women.
