Manasi Parekh Says 'Big Producers' Cautioned Her Against Marriage: 'They Said I'd Get Fat' | Exclusive



2024 has been rather special for Manasi Parekh. Not only did she mark two decades as an actor but also won the National Film Award for Best Actress for her performance in Kutch Express. However, her initial days in the entertainment industry was no cakewalk. In an exclusive chat with News18 Showsha, Manasi opens up on how she was dissuaded from getting married to her then boyfriend, musician Parthiv Gohil. "I was married in the middle of India Calling shoot. So, my career started and I got married. A lot of people told me, 'What are you doing?'
You just started out!'" she says.

She goes on to reveal that she was cautioned against tying the knot as she would gain weight that would lead her to lose out on work. "Big producers

have come to me and told me that I would get fat after marriage and that main apne khud ke pair pe kulhaadi maar rahi hoon. I'm sure they said these things out of goodwill but I don't know how fatness and marriage are related. Maybe they meant that I would become complacent after marriage," she recalls.

Manasi further adds, "They went on to tell me that I won't be able to do any work because nobody would cast me. I never wanted to follow the route and even then, I knew that this is the path that I want to choose for myself. I wanted to be with Parthiv and see where it takes me. I'm glad I followed my gut. No one can make life rules for you. If you've conviction and if you're working well and working hard, kaam $a at a \, hi \, rahega. \, All \, these \, perceptions$ that a woman won't get work post marriage didn't happen to me."

However, she's happy with the way things are changing for women in cinema today. Citing a few examples, she states, "I'm very vocal about the fact that women should be accepted for the age that they're in. People used to say earlier that once you hit 40, your career and shelf life is over. But look at all these incredible actresses like Konkona Sensharma, Shefali Shah and

Tabu! They're iconic women and are still working. In fact, I think that they're getting better with age. Ratna (Pathak Shah) ben is a true icon, according to me. She told me that this is the most work that she has ever done." Getting older, according to Manasi, should rather be an upside rather than a dealbreaker. Recalling her conversation with Shruti Seth, she remarks, "She's a stunning actor. She was telling me that the age that she's in should be the end of an actress' career but that she looks at it as the best phase of her career and she's looking forward to where her journey takes her. I think age should be appreciated and rejoiced rather than be shamed or embarrassed about. If you're a good actor, you'll be ageless and people will keep writing good roles for you.'

sible rivalry between Madhuri Dixit Nene and Sridevi. Gossip magazines were abuzz with stories of how the divas were arch-nemesis, especially after the Dhak Dhak girl replaced the late actor as the top female star in Bollywood. In 1994, in an interview to Stardust, Sridevi subtly pointed how Madhuri had imitated her style of acting in Khalnayak. "A lot of other stars also imitate the distinct styles of prominent stars. What's the big deal if she did a take-off on me? It is their profession. But frankly speaking, I'd never do it," she had said.

So, when Sridevi attended Madhuri and Dr Shriram Nene's wedding reception in 1999, it raised many eyebrows. And interestingly, the only film they appeared together in was Ramesh Sippy's Zameen (1987). The duo, however, didn't get to share screen space in it and the film never saw the light of the day. Now, years later, in an exclusive conversation with News18 Showsha, Madhuri spilled the beans on her equation

The Bhool Bhulaiyaa 3 actor addressed how they

against each other and told us, "We never worked together. There was one movie that we did long back but even then, we didn't have any scenes together. We had different scenarios going for us in terms of our careers. Our paths never really crossed in that sense. But, of course, we both had a lot of respect and admiration for each other. I had respect for her as an actor as she worked in different languages - which was amazing – and she was successful across them. She was also very sweet to me.

Years later, Madhuri worked on Srivedi and Boney Kapoor's Pukaar (2000). But even then, there was barely any exchange between them. Talking about it, Madhuri said,

"Pukaar was Boney ji's production. So, she was the producer of that film. There was not much interaction between us because she was doing her own thing and I was doing mine. We didn't really get to talk much."

But what did Sridevi have to tell her after Pukaar? "After we completed Pukaar and it released, I was married and went to the US. That's why there wasn't so much interaction. She entered the industry before I did and she had been working since she was a little kid. She worked really hard to be where she was and I really respected that," recalled Madhuri. In a recent interview, Javed Akhtar spoke about

how women actors like Madhuri and Sridevi didn't get big roles as society wasn't clear about who a contemporary woman was. Reacting to his words, Madhuri stated, "Commercial cinema of that time had many constraints in terms of what will work, what won't, what's good, what's not and if family audiences can watch them. But we still tried to play different characters within those constraints and we did break the glass ceiling and find different kinds of roles, and that's what makes us women.'

This is an all time low from you and speaks so much about your character," wrote Nayanthara.
