India, EU to discuss geo-political challenges, Chinese belligerence

10: India and the European Union today agreed to hold the firstever ministerial strategic foreign policy dialogue soon to jointly navigate an array of critical challenges including geo-political tensions and Chinese belligerence in the Indo-Pacific and beyond.

The decision to institute the strategic dialogue was taken during a phone conversation between External Affairs Minister S Jaiscounterpart from the 27nation bloc Kaja Kallas.

In a post on 'X', Kallas, the EU High Representative for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy, said it was agreed to hold the first ministerial strategic for-

NEW DELHI, DEC 10: Opposition parties to-

day submitted a notice to move a motion for removing Vice-President Jagdeep Dhankhar for allegedly conducting the House in a partisan manner. Congress leaders

Jairam Ramesh and Naseer Hussain submitted the notice to Rajya Sabha Secretary General P.C.

Vice-President Jagdeep Dhankhar is the ex-Officio Chairman of the Rajya Sabha.

The sources said about 60 Opposition MPs - including from the Congress, the RJD, the TMC, the CPI, the CPI-M, the JMM, the AAP, the DMK - have signed the notice. However, they said top

Congress leaders who hold constitutional posts have not signed the notice.

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge, Congress Parliamentary Party chairperson Sonia Gandhi and the floor leaders of various Opposition parties are also not among the signa-



tories, the sources said.

The notice, spearheaded by the Congress, comes in the wake of turbulent ties between Opposition parties and the Rajya Sabha Chairman.

"ALL parties belonging to the INDIA group have had no option but to formally submit a no-confidence motion against the learned Hon'ble Chairman of the Rajya Sabha for the extremely partisan manner in which he has been conducting the proceedings of the Council of States. It has been a very painful decision for the INDIA parties to take, but in the interests of parliamentary democracy they have had to take this step," Congress general secretary (In-charge, Communications)

Ramesh posted on X.

TMC MP and its deputy leader in the Rajya Sabha Sagarika Ghose said, "Signed by all and being moved today against Vice President. We do not have the numbers to win, but it is a strong message to fight for parliamentary democracy. Nothing against individuals, this is a fight for institutions."

The Opposition has been upset with Dhankhar over multiple issues, the latest being him allowing the members of the Treasury Benches to raise the Cong-Soros "link" issue in the Upper House.

A bench of Justices Vikram Nath and P B Varale was informed by the Centre about the top court's judgement on internet shutdowns in Anuradha Bhasin's case.

Union of India, the Apex

In Anuradha Bhasin v.

Court ruled that an undefined restriction of internet services was illegal and orders for internet shutdown must satisfy the tests of necessity and proportionality.

On Tuesday, the petition before the bench alleged shutting down of internet services in some states on account of preventing cheating in examinations.

"We have issued specific letters to the chief secretaries that there is a judgement of Anuradha Bhasin which lays down the law, please follow that law. Please ensure that it is not used outside the legislative

parameters that have been provided," said the counsel representing the Centre.

The lawyer said the Centre had filed its counter affidavit in the matter.

Advocate Vrinda Grover, appearing for the petitioner, said it was a very interesting matter where internet shutdowns were being imposed by different states for preventing cheating in exams.

'There are multiple other ways in which cheating can be prevented," she said, "such internet shutdowns affect the economic activity
